After the breakdown of a relationship, a friend of mine once declared her intention to build a walled-in area around herself into which she would never again let anyone else come. I empathise with the sentiment but what a wealth of experience of life she would have missed out on if she had held to that view.

In his book The Learning of Love, Simon Parke expresses like this: First of all, love greets. In those early moments, love welcomes. In the beginning, love establishes safety for the other. Love establishes space for the other. To give such love is to die a little, of course, but to receive it? Well, it's like stepping into a sunlit playground after triple maths . . .

I was recently watching a programme celebrating the 30<sup>th</sup>

anniversary of one of my favourite tearjerker films, the magical *ET*. The film tells the story of how a small boy, Elliott. comes to

love a strange and alien creature. It depicts the often hilarious way their love and friendship develops and their ultimate triumph over the hierarchy of adults with too little imagination, too much prejudice and not enough love. Along with the love comes the inevitable time of pain and separation and when Elliott thinks ET has died he says "I don't know how to feel. I can't feel anything any more."

I expect we all have times when a sense of loss, a bereavement or a relationship breakdown leaves us with a similar sense of numbness, and perhaps like my friend we want to wall ourselves in, to prevent further damage. However, we have an infinitely more reliable source of *Love* words than popular culture can provide, and the unfathomable depths of the Love of God with which we can surround ourselves.

One of the abiding images of comfort that I return to at times of vulnerability and pain is that of the huge hand of God holding me as a small child. Safe and secure, snuggled into the Love of God, protected from pain around me and then enabled to love again and to go on loving.

Despite its potential for pain, without that experience of love we are so much less than God

created us to be. "I have come that you might have life, life in all its fullness," said Jesus. That fullness of life is most exquisitely experienced through Love - which is indeed, a many splendoured thing and I hope that you will also find it is all around, enriching and enabling your life. • The man told me he had fought

with drug addiction for years and

that during that time he had forgotten about God. I reassured him that God had not forgotten about him and that God loved him to bits, and had never left him. The man was quite tearful when I told him how much God loved him - Thank You for giving me the chance to witness this!

I was filthy with dust, my clothes stank of damp and I was incredibly grubby, but I honestly felt that I had never been more blessed! Praise God! Pam R


