What are you giving up for Lent?

The question is often asked. Giving something up for 40 days is a custom which can help us enter into the season with a sense of purpose and greater awareness.

Consider looking at Lent in a deeper way. For many of us, giving up something is the beginning and end of our reflections on Lent. We went to the Ash Wednesday service to begin Lent, so there's nothing to worry about now til Palm Sunday or even Maundy Thursday! It can be tempting to say, *I'm giving up beer / chocolates / sweets / alcohol / TV / Cinema / biscuits*, but without more reflection, it can become simply a way of showing God and other people how strong we are; being more about us than any conversation / relationship we have with God.

Then at the end of Lent we go back to what we gave up. Lent isn't simply about us *giving up* something. Lent is a season in which God wants to *give* us something. God wants to help to transform our lives and make us more free as people. This year, we might reflect and ask the deeper question:

What is God inviting me to change this Lent?

How do I know what God is stirring in me?

Begin by listening to your heart: *Where am I feeling uncomfortable with the choices I make? With the things I have done? With the habitual ways I respond?* The Lord will be speaking to us in those small nagging moments of discomfort.

It might be that we know deep down that giving up sweets and biscuits will be better for our health, so it's the right thing to do. Asking *what about ourselves we would like to change this Lent* requires a little more reflection.

Each of us can think of something that gets in the way of our relationship with God. Instead of just giving something up, commit to taking something on!

1. building your relationship with God by more time spent reading / studying your Bible.
2. finding more time for prayer.
3. making space to helping other people.
4. donating to a charity.

As you come into Church, to your right, this map of the world is on the notice board. We use it to pray for the needs of the world.

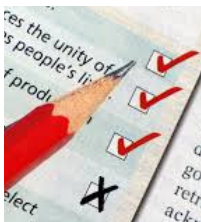
