

## **Great Wave of Prayer**

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have invited churches to pray for the evangelisation of the nation during the week before Pentecost Sunday (8<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> May).

The week of prayer will culminate in 'Beacon events' around the country over Pentecost weekend, where people will pray for the renewal of the Holy Spirit and the confidence to share their faith.

The Archbishops said: 'At the heart of our prayers will be words that Jesus himself taught us - 'Thy kingdom come, thy will be done.' It is impossible to overstate the life-transforming power

of the Lord's Prayer. It is a prayer that is reassuring enough to be on the lips of the dying and yet dangerous enough to be banned in cinemas.

It is famous enough to be spoken each day by billions in hundreds of languages and yet intimate enough to draw us ever closer into friendship with Jesus Christ. It is simple enough to be memorised by small children and yet profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of prayer. When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to his glory.'
