Building Project Update

Progress with the building project may be invisible, but it is continuing. Discussions with the DAC and our architect have brought us to

the point where our plans are almost finalised. We'll be applying for planning permission for a new building for church and community use to the north side of the church, but extending about 5 yards forward of it, with a welcoming cafe/foyer area at the front. The plans for the church interior(a more open space that can be used flexibly, a crèche, a more open and welcoming entrance, better lighting etc) are also close to being decided, and the PCC has approved the principle of beginning this part of the project as soon as we have funds for it.

The recent public consultation, in which so many of you took part, was very successful and has provided useful evidence of the need for the new facilities to support our applications for planning permission and funding. St Mark's has now been put up for sale by tender, so it is likely that before the end of the year we will have some funds with which to begin the project.
