the Pastoral Ministry

Currently this team comprises: Julie Johnson, Grace Anderson, Margaret Bryant, Sue Levene, Audrey Mannion and Rita Waters.

Members aim to know who is who in our congregation and Home Groups. This leads to taking note of who is missing and following up by phone, e-mail or home visit.

In addition, we visit church members in their home situation in order to grow in friendship and Christian fellowship, as we listen to their stories and pray with them. Julie has oversight of those ministering and receiving Home Communion.

We may not always speak to those we already know over coffee or at church events: we make welcoming newcomers our priority. We would like to see this naturally observant and actively caring style of pastoral ministry become part of everyone's Christian commitment, with the request that you tell Julie who you are in touch with regularly, so the Team can identify where the gaps are.

Team Talk

Here's what's happening in the ministries this month:

Social and Community ~ We have had a team meeting to plan the summer fair; it was lovely to have extra volunteers coming to the meeting too! We are encouraging everyone from church to get involved and we have been encouraged by the response so far.

Our last big events were the *Pub Quiz* on 3rd July and Summer Fair on 20th July. Look out for a Curry Lunch in August! I

It has been lovely working with the *C&YP* team in planning the summer activities, and great to hear that the *Prayer* team will have people available for prayer during the fair.

Pastoral ~ Due to some mobility issues Julie has not been doing her usual round of visits, but phone and text is a wonder! It is noted that there is a growing fragility in some of our regular church members.

We are encouraged to see other than named team members taking natural pastoral care - and then telling Julie.

The team would like prayer from church members for more observational pastoral care; followed by action and communication!

Children & Young People ~ The team's busiest time is approaching for CYP as we provide a family activity *each*

week of the holidays to anyone in the parish:

Holiday club - for 5-11 and, for the first time, 11-12 year olds.

Swim parties on Mondays. A **cinema** afternoon.

A trip to the seaside.

Obviously, we are going to need help: we need more adult helpers for the older holiday club. We need people to make tea and coffee for after the pool parties (they don't need to go in the pool). We need folk to help us on the coach trip.

Most importantly, we need an army of people to pray for all our events; for the people leading them; and for the children and families who will be attending. When we do take time to listen, God inspires us. It was His idea to try holiday club for older children, so we are stepping out in faith...

Prayer ~ The Prayer Ministry team met at the beginning of the month. We are looking to find some new things for the 'candle' table for the children. Irene has found some toys and a sticker book: Di will look when she has the time to go into town.

We hope to have a Healing Prayers place at the Summer Fair and/or Fun Day.

We need someone to research topics for the World Prayer Map.

We are looking for extra members for our Team, and also looking to expand the Healing Prayer Team.

Communications ~ Karen had to step back from the team due to health issues. She is greatly missed! Arthur has kindly agreed to post St Matthew's events to the Deanery website. As this is a new venture, that still leaves Linda working alone. Help is desperately needed and, if you don't feel able to electronically, prayer is invited on the team's behalf.
