Shining a Light on Torch Trust - the Christian organisation with a vision for people with sight loss

Torch Trust has been working with blind and partially sighted people for 53 years. Based in Leicestershire, the organisation has an amazing history and an international reach.

Providing accessible Christian literature - in Braille, giant print and audio formats - has always been a significant part of what Torch does. Seven different magazines for blind and partially sighted adults and children are produced for readers in 100 countries. Bibles, Bible study materials, devotional publications and Christian books are provided in the range of formats, for sale or for free distribution. Torch runs the largest Christian lending library of accessible books in Europe. Through a free postal service, people with sight loss can access over 3,500 titles, with 100 - plus new titles being added every year.

Though the technology has moved on, the work of Torch remains true to its original vision, says Torch CEO Dr Gordon Temple. The aim of Torch Trust is to enable people with sight loss to discover Christian faith and lead fulfilling Christian lives. The gospel is inclusive. Jesus was inclusive - and went out of his way to include blind people, and those with other disabilities.

A Year of Toddle Time

Last September, with much prayer and some trepidation, we opened the doors of the church to strangers for *Toddle Time*. This July we held a teddy bears'



picnic in glorious sunshine with friends. We did this by transforming the back of the church into a safe play space for young children, with areas for toy kitchens, train sets and craft; not forgetting a special area for babies.

A typical morning begins with free play and crafts while parent and carers enjoy a brew and a natter, this is followed by healthy snack time, treasure chest and song time.

Each week, 25 to 30 babies and toddlers attend, bringing with them their mums, dads



and childminders. This is an excellent way to connect with our local community.
