Discipleship: Two initiatives planned for the autumn are now underway: First, a programme of study for the homegroups. At present we are following a sixweek course of 'Praying with the Psalms', using a study booklet. For those who can't get to a group, a brief summary posted each week on the website allows them to follow the studies. After half term we will be moving on to the letter of James, a book which amongst other things considers the relationship between faith and good works in the Christian life.

Shining a Light on
Torch Trust(2) the Christian
organisation with a vision
for people with sight loss

Torch Trust has been working with blind and partially sighted people for 53 years. Based in Leicestershire, the organisation has an amazing history and an international reach. This time we hear about Torch groups.

Acceptance And Friendship

People with sight loss often find themselves lonely or isolated - excluded from social events that sighted people take for granted. It can be good to meet with those who face the same issues, to share experiences, find resources and be encouraged.

Torch Trust runs over 100 Torch Fellowship Groups around the UK, generally meeting on a monthly basis, for a varied and informal programme of activities, all within an environment of Christian fellowship and often based at a local church. New groups are starting all the time.

More recently, different kinds of Torch groups have been trialled and launched, meeting the need for different kinds of social contact. These include telephone friendship groups, called TorchTalk, and book groups - where blind and partially sighted people meet together informally to discuss Christian audio books provided by Torch.
