Shining a Light on
Torch Trust(4) the Christian
organisation with a vision
for people with sight loss

Torch Trust has been working with blind and partially sighted people for 53 years. Based in Leicestershire, the organisation has an amazing history and an international reach. This time we hear about Torch groups. In this final article, we explore its work in Africa.

TORCH IN AFRICA

Around sixty Torch Fellowship groups meet in Malawi and across the border in Mozambique, to encourage and support blind and partially sighted people who are literally the poorest of the poor. There are frequent droughts and famines; and blind people are especially vulnerable to robbers taking even the little they have. Many are victims of the widespread eve disease known as River Blindness.

Every year Torch International Leader Janet Stafford makes extended trips to Malawi, doing her best to visit many of the groups, distributing aid and bringing Bible teaching and spiritual encouragement, holding clinics to distribute basic medical items. She spends time in Torch House in Malawi, too, where Bible portions and other Christian literature in Braille and giant print is produced by national staff in a number of African languages.


proud to support Cancer Research UK, who had a very successful day with us.
