#### What is Alpha?


Alpha is a series of interactive sessions that freely explore the basics of the Christian faith.

This is no ordinary miracle of birth but a gift from God. Indeed, God Himself come among us at last. Emmanuel, God with us.



It's that time of year again... a time of giving and receiving; a time when our wallets and purses lose weight whilst our waistlines expand!

Some people in our local community, however, have no money to spend and rely on the generosity of others for a decent meal.

The Wellspring, situated on Harvey Street just around the corner from Stockport Market, is open 365 days a

year and provides a lifeline and place of hope and comfort for homeless people, or those who are at risk of becoming homeless.

For several years now we, as a church, have



collected presents to be handed out at the Wellspring Christmas Lunch. Small presents, costing no more than £2 each, but with little gifts of warm gloves or socks,

something smelly or something sweet (no alcohol or tobacco) to show that we care.

Please support our *Christmas Present* Appeal for *The Wellspring* by bringing along as many gifts as you can (we need 130) and marking them either



man, woman or either. If you wish, you could add a card.

If you are concerned for the homeless, you could also help with the *Rucksack Project*. Go to charity shops or rummage through your

wardrobes, get a rucksack, sleeping bag, gloves, hat and scarf, fleece, undies, socks, toothbrush, flask, and tins of food with ring pulls, spoon, puzzles and pens and drop them off at Wellspring.

The rucksack packs will then be distributed to homeless people and rough sleepers in Stockport.

If you can't make a full pack, then donate any of the items listed and packs will be made

from items received.
